

Cookie Policy

Our Cookie Policy has been developed to explain how we use cookies on our websites, and to demonstrate our firm commitment to protecting the privacy of your data.

The first time that you visit our website, we notify you about our use of cookies through a notification banner. By continuing to use the website, you consent to our use of cookies as described in this Cookie Policy. However, you can choose whether or not to continue accepting cookies at any later time. Information on how to control and delete cookies is set out later in this Cookie Policy.

What are Cookies?

Cookies are small pieces of information used to identify your computer which are stored by your browser on your computer's hard drive when you access a website. The cookies are then sent back to the website on each subsequent visit, allowing the site to provide its online services. Cookies contain basic information about your internet use, but they do not normally identify you personally. Please note that our use of any information we collect about you through cookies is subject to our privacy policy.

Cookies can be Session Cookies or Persistent Cookies. Session cookies allow a website to link a user's series of actions during one browser session, for example to remember the items you have added to your shopping basket. Session cookies expire after a browser session and are therefore not stored on your computer afterwards. Persistent cookies are stored on a user's computer between browser sessions and can be used to record a user's website preferences, such as language or font size.

Most web browsers automatically accept cookies, but you can change your browser's settings to prevent that if you wish. However, disabling cookies would prevent you from using some of our services.

Note that if you visit the site only to browse or learn more about our products, and not to purchase, we will not create a cookie.

The cookies used on our website are based on the International Chamber of Commerce guide for cookie categories:

1. Strictly Necessary

'Strictly Necessary' cookies let you move around the website and use essential features like secure areas and shopping baskets. These cookies don't gather any information about you that could be used for marketing or remembering where you've been on the internet.

We use these Strictly Necessary cookies to...

- Remember things like information you've entered when ordering and when you navigate to different pages in a single web browser session
- Remember the products you ordered when you get to the checkout page
- Make sure you connect to the right service on our website when we make any changes to the way the website works

Cookies we have defined as 'Strictly Necessary' cookies will NOT be used to...

- Gather information that could be used to advertise products or services to you
- Remember your preferences or username beyond your current visit

Accepting these cookies is a condition of using the website, so if you prevent these cookies we

can't guarantee your security or predict how our website will perform during your visit.

2. Performance

'Performance' cookies collect information about how you use our website e.g. which pages you visit, and if you experience any errors. These cookies don't collect any information that could identify you – all the information collected is anonymous and is only used to help us improve how our website works, understand what interests our users and measure how effective our advertising is.

We use performance cookies to...

- Provide statistics on how our website is used
- See how effective our adverts are (we don't use this information to target adverts to you when you visit other websites)
- Help us improve the website by measuring any errors that occur

Cookies we have defined as 'Performance' cookies will NOT be used to...

- Gather information that could be used to advertise products or services to you on other websites
- Remember your preferences or username beyond your current visit
- Target adverts to you on any other website

In some cases, some of these cookies are managed for us by third parties, but we don't allow the third party to use the cookies for any purpose other than those listed above.

3. Functionality

'Functionality' cookies are used to provide services or to remember settings to improve your visit.

We use 'Functionality' cookies to...

- Remember settings you've applied such as layout, text size, preferences and colours
- Show you when you're logged in to the website

Cookies defined as 'Functionality' will not be used to...

- Target you with adverts on other websites

Some of these cookies are managed for us by third parties – where this is the case we don't allow the third party to use the cookies for any purpose other than those listed above.

You can control whether or not these cookies are used, but preventing them may mean we can't offer you some services, and will reduce the support we can offer you.

4. Targeting

'Targeting' cookies are linked to services provided by third parties, such as 'Like' buttons and 'Share' buttons. The third party provides these services in return for recognising that you have visited our website.

We use 'Targeting' cookies to...

- Link to social networks like Facebook, who may subsequently use information about your visit to target advertising to you on other websites
- Provide advertising agencies with information on your visit so that they can present you

with adverts that you may be interested in.

You can control whether or not these cookies are used, but preventing them may stop us from offering you some services e.g. linking to third party 'like' or 'share' capabilities. All of these cookies are managed by third parties, and you may alternatively use the third parties' own tools to prevent these cookies.

Cookies set by Third Party sites

We occasionally embed video content from websites such as YouTube. As a result, when you visit a page with content embedded from websites such as YouTube, you may be presented with cookies from these websites. Informa UK Limited does not control the dissemination of these cookies. You should check the relevant third party website for more information about these.
